



## Dr Rob Ross Russell

Following his training in Cambridge and London, Dr Ross Russell worked in London (St Georges, Great Ormond Street, Brompton, Kings) and was appointed as a consultant in Paediatric Intensive Care at Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge in 1992. He set up a regional intensive care service but also established the basis of the current respiratory service, establishing a cystic fibrosis team. In 2008 he moved from PICU to concentrate on respiratory work, with research interests in physiology, ethics and teaching. In 2019 he reduced his clinical work, and now works one day a week at Addenbrookes.

However, he keeps busy as Director of Studies in Medicine at Peterhouse, the oldest of the Cambridge colleges where he supervises in physiology. Until last year, he was also Chair of the European Board of Paediatrics and was heavily involved in the development of the EBP/EAP exam. In his quiet moments, he also works as a medicolegal expert, writing reports and occasionally going to court.

In his spare time he enjoys reading, golf and the company of his five grandchildren.
